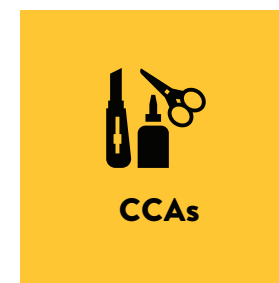

### QUICK FAQ

#### How do Nexus learners get involved in the ACSIS Sport Season 2 programme?

The sign-ups will allow learners (or parents of children from Year 1 to Year 4) to select sports via the 'School Buddy' Activities portal'. The Activities Portal will open on **Wednesday 9 November at 5.00pm** and will close on **Friday 25 November** (the end of the 2nd week of training). Please note that during this period only ACSIS Season 2 Sport selections can be made.

#### When does training begin for ACSIS Season 2 Sports?

ACSIS Season 2 sport training will begin from Monday 14 November and will follow the schedule presented below. The advertised days and times will then become the regular training days for these teams.

#### Will everyone play matches?

All learners who sign up for a sport team will be given the opportunity to train with the squad on the regular training day. However, if sign-up numbers are large, team selection for fixtures will be done on a weekly basis. Fixtures will start from **Monday 28 November**.

#### When do Season 2 CCAs start?

Season 2 School CCAs and ACSIS sports fixtures start on **Monday 28 November** and sign ups will also open on **Wednesday 9 November**.

The Portal will then reopen at **12 noon on Thursday 17 November**, where additional choices can be made. Phase Two will close at **12noon on Friday 18 November**. This is when all remaining CCA places will be allocated.

## BEFORE SIGNING UP FOR CCAS

If you have signed up for an ACSIS sport team check carefully to ensure that the sessions do not clash.

## KEY INFORMATION

### CCA GATHERING POINT

Primary learners will be directed to the relevant activity meet up points. Secondary learners should go directly to the location of their activity. The location information can be found on pages 10-13, and on the SchoolsBuddy platform.

### PICK UP POINT

After CCAs in the afternoon, learners can be picked up from the Level 2 Eco Cafe, outside the Learner Services office. Younger learners who are taking the CCA bus will be taken to the bus bay by the CCA teacher.

Please note that parents, guardians, helpers and SUPERVISED siblings may wait in the eco cafe to collect a learner whilst a CCA or Nexus run sports training event is in session after school.

Please select CCAs that your child will commit to for the whole season. The system randomly allocates places and there is no advantage to selecting early in this process. Due to the length of the school day CCAs are not available for Nursery learners.

Kindergarten learners will be allocated up to 2 CCAs.

Year 1 learners will be allocated up to 3 CCAs.

All learners from Year 2 upwards will be assigned up to a maximum of 5 CCAs, depending on the popularity of the CCAs.

Learners from Year 5 upwards should make their own choices **with parental guidance**.

Parents will not be able to do this through their own portal login.

Please note that your child may not get all the choices he / she signs up for.

## TRANSPORTATION

At the end of CCAs, learners can take the 4.35pm door-to-door activities bus for an additional charge. To ensure a place on this services for the first week of CCAs, you must email Tong Tar, call 6261 5537 or [register here](#). More contact details are available at [www.nexus.edu.sg](http://www.nexus.edu.sg) in the Parent Zone. Parents who are picking up learners at 4.30pm can meet their child at the Eco Cafe on level 2.

## COSTS

Many CCAs are offered free of charge; if there is a cost associated with the CCA this is indicated. Payments for CCAs should be made once your child receives confirmation of a place on this activity. All payments should be made online (see below). Please note that all CCA payments should be completed by **9 December 2022** (end of week 2 of CCAs). Learners will only be able to attend their CCA in week 3 if payment has been made in full. Please note that all CCA choices will be taken as final at the end of week 2. You will be billed for the whole season for all paid CCAs your child is registered for at the end of week 2. Please be aware that if your child is absent or a paid CCA is cancelled by the school due to unforeseen circumstances e.g. haze or adverse weather, there will be no 'make-up' class or reimbursement. This also applies to school residential trips and day camps.

If the COVID-19 guidelines change during the season resulting in us cancelling a paid CCA, we will do our absolute best to recover the cost from our providers. However, this is not guaranteed and the school will not be held liable to repay the cost of the CCA.
