

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES (CCAs)

KEY DATES & TIMES

THERE ARE TWO PHASES FOR CCA SIGN-UPS.

Phase One

The Activities Portal will open at 10am Thursday 14 January 2021.

The Portal will close at 10am on Tuesday 19 January and activities will be allocated.

Phase Two

The Portal will then reopen at 4pm on Tuesday 19 January, where additional choices can be made.

Phase Two will close at 10am on Thursday 21 January.

This is when all remaining CCA places will be allocated.

SEASON TWO RUNS FROM 25 JANUARY 2021 TO 19 MARCH 2021 (8 WEEKS).

KEY INFORMATION

COVID - 19 IMPACT ON CCAs

- Due to COVID-19 restrictions, we will continue to run CCAs within the phase groups to avoid mixing year groups as much as possible. As such, you may find activities that were offered for your child's year group before, may not be available to them this Season. We hope to resume to our regular CCA programme as soon as safe distancing measures allow us to do so.
- If the COVID-19 guidelines change during the season resulting in us cancelling a paid CCA, we will do our absolute best to recover the cost from our providers. However, this is not guaranteed and the school will not be held liable to repay the cost of the CCA.
- Following COVID-19 guidelines, learners will stay socially distanced, hands will be washed, and classrooms will be sanitised.

CCA Gathering point

Primary learners will be met by their activity teachers in their learning hubs. Learners from Year 5 and above should go directly to the location of their activity. The location information can be found on pages 10-13, and on the [Activities Portal](#).

Pick up point

After CCAs in the afternoon, learners can be picked up from the Level 2 Eco Cafe, outside the Learner Services office.

Younger learners who are taking the CCA bus will be taken to the bus bay by the CCA teacher.

Please note that parents, guardians, helpers and siblings may not wait on-site to collect a learner whilst a CCA or sports training is in session

Date to note

There will be no CCAs for Primary Learners on **Friday 5 February** due to the primary learning conferences.

Please select CCAs that your child will commit to for the whole season.

The system randomly allocates places and there is no advantage to selecting early in this process.

Due to the length of the school day CCAs are not available for Nursery learners.

Kindergarten learners will be allocated up to 2 CCAs (1 CCA, 1 paid CCA).

Year 1 learners will be allocated up to 3 CCAs (2 CCA, 1 paid CCA).

All learners from Year 2 upwards will be assigned up to a maximum of 5 CCAs, (3 CCAs, 2 paid CCAs) depending on the popularity of the CCAs.

Learners from Year 5 upwards should make their own choices with parental guidance. Parents will not be able to do this through their own portal login.

PARTICIPATION IN CCA SESSIONS & EVENTS

Please take time to read over the various activities on offer and discuss with your child which CCAs they would like to commit to. We strongly encourage every learner to commit to at least one CCA each season and also to take part in at least one voluntary event per year.

CCAs do not run during school or public holidays.

ADDITIONAL SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

SWIMMING AT NEXUS

Please note that the Nexus Swim Squads will continue to train as established. This programme runs throughout the year. Due to COVID-19 restrictions, we will not be running Recreational Swimming CCA this season. Swim squad trials happen only once at the beginning of the Academic Year. Learners may also be identified during their swimming lessons and invited to join a swim squad during the year.

GYMNASTICS

We are pleased to offer Gymnastics for Years 1 & 2 (Tuesdays) and Years 3 & 4 (Fridays) at North Star Gymnastics, located at Singpost Centre Mall.

The Gymnastics programme will run in semesters (19 weeks for Tuesdays and 15 weeks for Fridays). The cost includes transport to and from the gym.

Learners can sign up through the [Activities Portal](#) at the start of Term 3.

Please Note that due to the time of this activity, there will be no CCA bus to take learners home from school. Learners who sign up for this should arrange to be picked up at 5.15pm from school

Please Note that due to COVID-19 restrictions, only a limited number of 10 places per CCA are available.

TRANSPORTATION

At the end of CCAs, learners can take the 4.35pm door-to-door activities bus for an additional charge. BEFORE SIGNING UP FOR CCAS

Do note that CCA Season 2 crosses over with ACSIS Seasons 2 and 3. If you are currently signed up for a sport in ACSIS Season 2 or intend to sign up for a Sport in ACSIS Season 3, please do not sign up for a Paid CCA run by an external vendor. Alternatively, you may choose to miss the end of ACSIS Season 2 or the start of ACSIS Season 3 to complete the CCA you have signed up for. Please note that we are unable to refund for any CCA sessions missed.

For example if you currently have Badminton for ACSIS Season 2 on Wednesdays but would like to sign up for Race Car Engineering in CCA Season 2, you have two choices:

1. Miss the last two badminton training sessions of ACSIS to attend Race Car Engineering
2. Miss the first two sessions of Race Car Engineering to attend Badminton. Do note there will be no refunds for the sessions missed.

It is important to take note of any ACSIS Sports in Season 3 you might like to sign up for as well in order to avoid a clash.

We do normally plan our CCA/ACIS programme carefully to avoid overlaps such as these. However, this Academic Year, the start of the CCA programme was intentionally delayed to take advantage of the Phase 3 guidelines. We are also not currently not playing any competition and matches during ACSIS sports. We do hope you understand.

COSTS

Many CCAs are offered free of charge; if there is a cost associated with the CCA this is indicated. Payments for CCAs should be made once your child receives confirmation of a place on this activity. All payments should be made online (see below). **Please note that all CCA payments should be completed by 5 February 2021 (end of week 2 of CCAs).** Learners will only be able to attend their CCA in week 3 if payment has been made in full. Please note that all CCA choices will be taken as final at the end of week 2. You will be billed for the whole season for all paid CCAs your child is registered for at the end of week 2.

Please be aware that if your child is absent or a paid CCA is cancelled by the school due to unforeseen circumstances e.g. haze or adverse weather, there will be no 'make-up' class or reimbursement. This also applies to school trips and camps.

BALLET YEARS 1 & 2

DANCE THEATRE ARTS

Year group:	Year 1, Year 2
Location:	01-West Hub Area/MPH
Time:	3.30 – 4.30
Cost:	276

Year 1 & 2 ballet is a build up of fundamental movement taught in the earlier levels. Learners are introduced to simple ballet techniques within the creative and nurturing environment of Melody Bear's world. In addition to an exciting variety of set exercises, creativity is explored with dances based on fairy stories with Melody Bear dancing as Cinderella, Little Red Riding Hood, Hansel and Gretel and the Tale of the Turnip. Additional fun themes include Melody Bear's octopus dance, sleeping ballerinas, new shoes, water lilies, friends in a house, the magic pool, and the 'Surprise' with each theme focusing on a different movement skill. Learners may wear HPE kit or purchase ballet kit directly from the provider.

BOOM, BANG, FIZZ, FUN SCIENCE YEARS 1 & 2

NEWTON SHOW

Questions help children form their view of the world. We can expand their horizons and knowledge by responding to their endless How? Why? What for? and When? questions. The more answers a child gets, the more they learn! Learners in this CCA will do a lot of experiments to understand how the world works, whilst gaining new knowledge and an interest in the world around them. Older learners might learn how to survive in the desert without water, use forensic science to track down a criminal, and prepare for an expedition to Mars. And this is only a small part of the plan!

BALLET YEARS 3 & 4

DANCE THEATRE ARTS

Year group:	Year 3, Year 4
Location:	Blackbox 2 Level 4
Time:	3.30 – 4.30

This CCA follows the Junior Ballet syllabus, and teaches children the basics of ballet and dance. In addition to simple barre and imaginative centre practice ideas, the syllabus has creative themes such as, the weeping willow fairy dance, the magic shawl dance, phoenix from the fire, and the woodland ball with the wicked witch as our uninvited guest! Learners are also introduced to the music of ballets such as Swan Lake, Giselle and Coppelia. Dancers will collect ballet vocabulary stickers in their Junior Ballet dictionary and work towards Level 1, 2 and 3 badges. The vocabulary includes French ballet terms, names of ballets and musical terms. Learners may wear HPE kit or purchase ballet kit directly from the provider.

CHINESE CHESS

XIANGQI MIND TRAIN ACADEMY

Chinese Chess, also known as Xiangqi represents a battle between two armies with the objective of capturing the enemy's General. Learn the moves and tactics for a strong opening, middle and end game.

Lego Robotics uses Lego bricks as a fun tool to explore robotics, mechanical systems, electronics, and programming. Students who enrol in this CCA are in for a very hands-on experience as it provides them with resources to design, build and program functional robots constructed from Lego and a few other parts, such as motors and sensors. It is open to both beginners and advanced learners of robotics and is run by expert instructors from D'Growing Hands.

LAMDA DRAMA YEARS 5 & 6

PANGDEMONIUM

LAMDA stands for the London Academy of Music and Dramatic Art and is one of the UK's most prestigious Performing Arts schools.

LAMDA are the UK's oldest examining board in speech and drama operating since 1861. They now have students across the globe working towards their internationally recognised qualifications and are known for excellence in the provision of communication and performance examinations. Students often go on to further their chosen career or simply take up the programmes as a worthwhile hobby. Higher grades also qualify for UCAS points and can be used towards the American College Entry forms.

Working towards a LAMDA examination is both fun and rewarding - within a safe environment learners can develop to their true potential and become a confident communicator in whichever career path they choose. There are various courses to choose from including public speaking, acting, musical theatre and verse and prose. Key skills include

Read easily, fluently and with understanding.

Expand your vocabulary.

Improve confidence in speaking and listening.

Research and create memorable presentations.

Work on your own or participate as part of a team.

Learners who participated in Season 1 are strongly recommended to sign up in Season 2 to continue with their exam preparations.
