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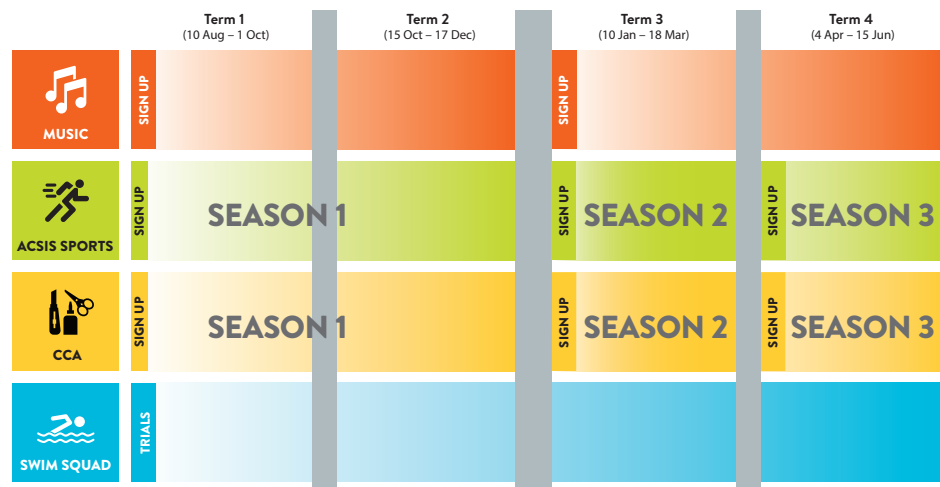

NEXUS SWIMMING

Welcome to Nexus Swimming. I hope that you had a great first semester and are looking forward to another fantastic swimming term ahead. Despite the current situation, we are very much looking forward to continuing our work with all our swimmers, who are ultimately, the future of Nexus Swimming.

You will not be surprised to read that we've had to limit the number of swimmers in each programme due to the restrictions enforced by SportSG, and we are currently operating with ratios of 15 swimmers per coach.

What to do if you would like to get involved?

If you are new to Nexus (joined after January 2022) and would like to be considered for the Nexus Swim Team, you will need to undertake a trial. Please email Ms. Larisa Mogutova mogutova.l@nexus.edu.sg to indicate your child's interest for a swim trial.

If your child is unsuccessful in their trial this time around, we will send an email recommending a team placement for when COVID19 restrictions will be lifted.

Expectations for the swim trial:

1. Your child must be able to perform at least three recognisable strokes (for example front crawl, butterfly, breaststroke) and have the endurance to swim 100 meters non-stop.
2. Your child must have an appropriate swimsuit, swim cap and goggles.

MODEL UNITED NATIONS CLUB

Model United Nations is an academic simulation of the United Nations where students play the role of delegates from different countries and attempt to solve real-world issues by taking the perspective of their assigned country. This is a learner-led activity where you will be supported by more experienced learners and staff to develop your written and oral communication skills in order to successfully participate in conferences. A model UN conference generally lasts two days and take place over weekends (we imagine all conferences taking place online until the next academic year).

Phase One

The Activities Portal will open at 3.00pm Wednesday 6 April 2022
The Portal will close at 10.00am on Tuesday 12 April and activities will be allocated.

Phase Two

The Portal will then reopen at 4pm on Tuesday 12 April where additional choices can be made. Phase Two will close at 10am on Thursday 14 April This is when all remaining CCA places will be allocated.

SEASON THREE RUNS FROM 18 APRIL 2022 TO 10 JUNE 2022 (8 WEEKS)

KEY INFORMATION COVID - 19 IMPACT ON CCAS

- Due to COVID-19 restrictions, we will continue to run Primary CCAs within the phase groups to avoid mixing year groups as much as possible. As such, you may find activities that were offered for your child's year group before, may not be available to them this Season. We hope to resume to our regular CCA programme as soon as safe distancing measures allow us to do so.
- If the COVID-19 guidelines change during the season resulting in us cancelling a paid CCA, we will do our absolute best to recover the cost from our providers. However, this is not guaranteed and the school will not be held liable to repay the cost of the CCA.
- Following COVID-19 guidelines, learners will stay socially distanced, hands will be washed, and classrooms will be sanitised.

CCA Gathering point

Primary learners will be met by their activity teachers in their learning hubs. Learners from Year 5 and above should go directly to the location of their activity. The location information can be found on pages 12 - 5, and on the [Activities Portal](#).

Pick up point

After CCAs in the afternoon, learners can be picked up from the Level 2 Eco Cafe, outside the Learner Services office. Younger learners who are taking the CCA bus will be taken to the bus bay by the CCA teacher.

Please note that parents, guardians, helpers and siblings may not wait on-site to collect a learner whilst a CCA or sports training is in session after school.

Please select CCAs that your child will commit to for the whole season.

The system randomly allocates places and there is no advantage to selecting early in this process. Due to the length of the school day CCAs are not available for Nursery learners.

Kindergarten learners will be allocated up to 2 CCAs (1 CCA, 1 paid CCA).
